## Luke 1:1-4

Since many have undertaken to set down an orderly account of the events that have been fulfilled among us, <sup>2</sup>just as they were handed on to us by those who from the beginning were eyewitnesses and servants of the word, <sup>3</sup>I too decided, after investigating everything carefully from the very first, to write an orderly account for you, most excellent Theophilus, <sup>4</sup>so that you may know the truth concerning the things about which you have been instructed.

## Luke 19.1-10

<sup>3</sup> He was trying to see who Jesus was, but on account of the crowd he could not, because he was short in stature.

<sup>4</sup> So he ran ahead and climbed a sycamore tree to see him, because he was going to pass that way.

## Luke 19.1-10

<sup>5</sup> When Jesus came to the place, he looked up and said to him, "Zacchaeus, hurry and come down; for I must stay at your house today."<sup>6</sup> So he hurried down and was happy to welcome him.

<sup>7</sup> All who saw it began to grumble and said, "He has gone to be the guest of one who is a sinner."

## Luke 19.1-10

<sup>8</sup> Zacchaeus stood there and said to the Lord,  
"Look, half of my possessions, Lord,  
I will give to the poor;  
and if I have defrauded anyone of anything,  
I will pay back four times as much."

## Luke 19.1-10

<sup>9</sup> Then Jesus said to him,  
"Today salvation has come to this house,  
because he too is a son of Abraham."

<sup>10</sup> For the Son of Man came  
to seek out and to save the lost."

According to the Gospel of Luke,  
to be a Steward of Life means:

- We are rich
- Faithful stewardship is NOT law-based
- A willing gift is thankfully/joyfully received and given
- Stewardship starts with relationship (even/especially with outcast)
- Reversal / conversion
- Giving is spontaneous response not calculated
