INTERROGATIVE Pronoun & Adjective

Who? Which? What? (Of whom? To whom? ...)

- As PRONOUN:
 - τίς ἀνήγγειλέν σοι ὅτι γυνμὸς εἶ; (Gen 3.11)
- As ADJECTIVE:
 - Τίς ἄνθρωπος ἐξ ὑμῶν ἔχων ἑκατὸν πρόβατα...; (Luke 15.4)
- Special: Accusative Neuter Singular
 - τί can also mean “Why?”
 - τί μεριμνᾶτε; (Matt 6.28)

Who? Which? What?

INDEFINITE Pronoun & Adjective
Someone/thing, a certain one/thing, anyone/thing

RELATIVE Pronoun
who, which, what

INDEFINITE RELATIVE Pronoun
whoever, whichever, whatever

... and now for something completely different...

3rd Declension Pattern - Note the accent!

INTERROGATIVE Pronoun & Adjective

- **τίς** (M/F) **τί** (Nt)
Who? Which? What?

- **Who** is loving God?
Τίς ἀγαπᾷ τὸν θεόν;

INDEFINITE ←

Pronoun & Adjective

Note the absence of accent on the !

INDEFINITE Pronoun & Adjective

Someone, something, a certain one, a certain thing, anyone, anything, some

- As PRONOUN:
 - Εἷ τις θέλει ὀπίσω μου ἔλθειν, ... (Matt 16.24)
- As ADJECTIVE:
 - Μετὰ δέ τινας ἡμέρας ... (Acts 15.36)

The RELATIVE Pronoun

NOM	ὅς	ἣ	ὅ	οἳ	αἵ	ἅ
GEN	οὗ	ἣς	οὗ	ᾧν	ᾧν	ᾧν
DAT	ᾧ	ἣ	ᾧ	οἷς	αἷς	οἷς
ACC	ὧν	ἣν	ὧ	οἷς	ἅς	ἅ

The RELATIVE Pronoun

- Watch for accent to distinguish from definite article
- Relative pronoun agrees in Number and Gender with its antecedent but takes the Case required by the syntax

EXCEPT in some cases when the antecedent is Genitive or Dative; syntax requires relative pronoun to be Accusative but it is attracted to the case of its antecedent

DAT	ᾧ	ἣ	ᾧ	οἷς	αἷς	οἷς
ACC	ὧν	ἣν	ὧ	οἷς	ἅς	ἅ

The RELATIVE Pronoun

- The antecedent can sometimes be omitted and the relative pronoun then needs to be translated as: “he who” or “the one who” etc.

The INTERROGATIVE and RELATIVE Pronoun

Καὶ ἔλεγεν αὐτοῖς, Βλέπετε **τί** ἀκούετε.

ἐν **ᾧ** μέτρῳ μετρεῖτε μετρηθήσεται ὑμῖν

Mark 4:24

CONDITIONAL RELATIVE Clauses

RELATIVE PRONOUN + ἐάν / ἄν + SUBJN

Whoever...

Whatever...

Also:

ὅπου + ἐάν / ἄν ... = Wherever...

ὅταν ... = Whenever

The RELATIVE Pronoun

Luke 24:44

Εἶπεν δὲ πρὸς αὐτούς·

οὗτοι οἱ λόγοι μου οὓς ἐλάλησα πρὸς ὑμᾶς

CONDITIONAL RELATIVE Clauses

Matt 5:19

ὃς ἐὰν οὖν λύσῃ μίαν τῶν ἐντολῶν τούτων...

The RELATIVE Pronoun

Ἴδου οἱ μαθηταί σου ποιοῦσιν

ὃ οὐκ ἔξεστιν ποιεῖν ἐν σαββάτῳ. (Matt 12.2)

INDEFINITE RELATIVE Pronoun

A combination of RELATIVE PRONOUN

ὃς ἢ ὅ

with the INDEFINITE PRONOUN

τις τι

>>>

ὅστις ἥτις ὅτι

Occurs only in NOMINATIVE (in LXX & NT)

Whoever, whatever...

The verb οἶδα

ὄραω >> εἶδον = to see

>> to know >>
οἶδα

Actually is a PERFECT translated as a PRESENT
The PLUPERFECT - ἤδειν – is translated as a past tense

Irregular Adjectives

πολύς πολλή πολύ
πολλοῦ πολλῆς πολλοῦ
...

μέγας μεγάλη μέγα
μεγάλου μεγάλης μέγαλου
...

Irregular forms in Masc and Neut Sing Nom/Acc
All other forms are regular and follow 1-2-1 pattern cf. Croy
pg. 173, §§204-205

The verb οἶδα

Matt 6.8

οἶδεν γὰρ ὁ πατήρ ὑμῶν ὧν χρείαν ἔχετε
πρὸ τοῦ ὑμᾶς αἰτῆσαι αὐτόν.

Definite Article before μέν and δέ Croy pp. 188- §221

- When there is no noun, participle, or other substantive following, the definite article has the force of a pronoun (s/he, it, they)
- Sometimes marks shift in subject
- Matthew 4.19f
καὶ λέγει αὐτοῖς, Δεῦτε ὀπίσω μου, καὶ ποιήσω ὑμᾶς ἀλιεῖς ἀνθρώπων.
οἱ δὲ εὐθέως ἀφέντες τὰ δίκτυα ἠκολούθησαν αὐτῷ.
